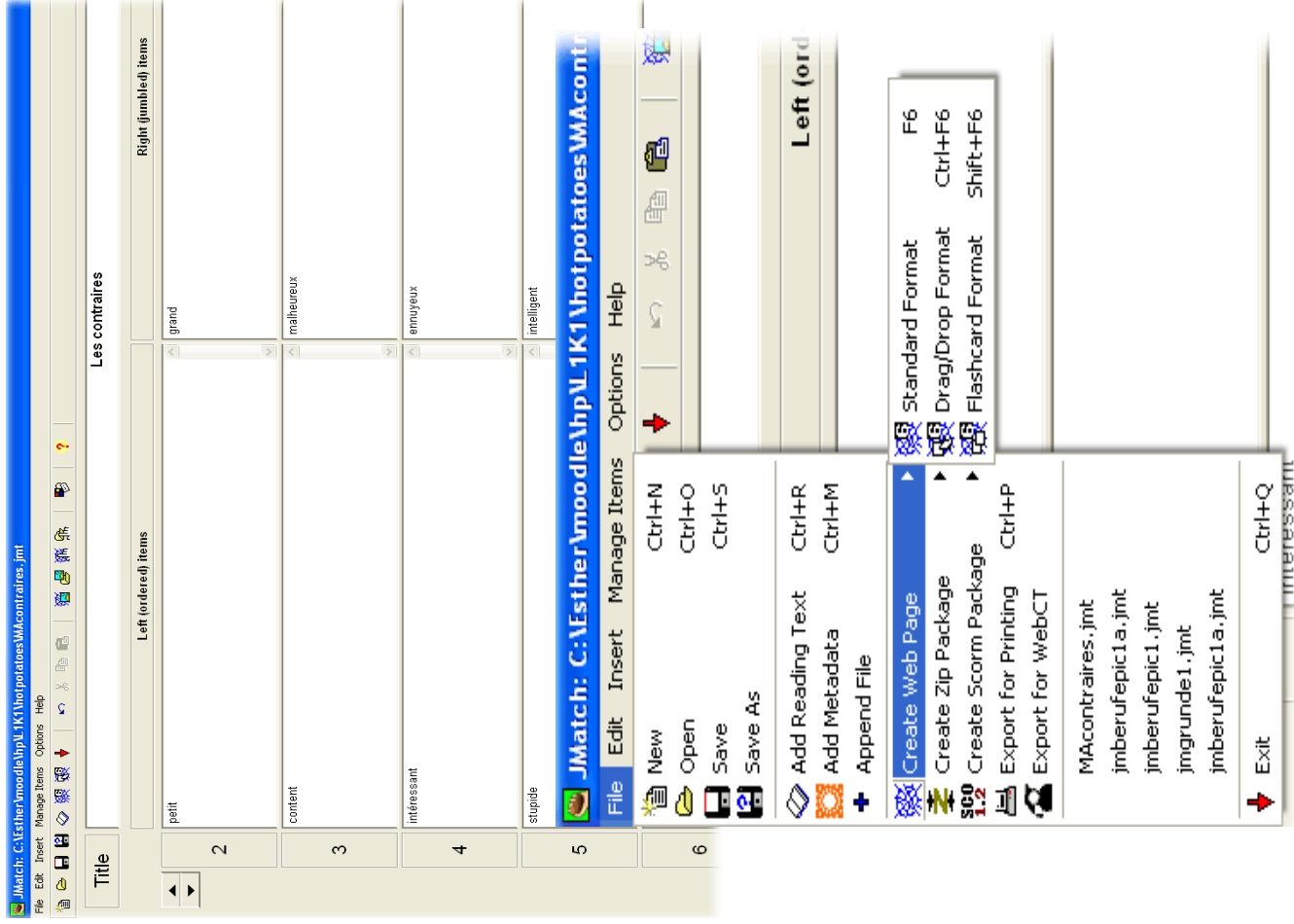
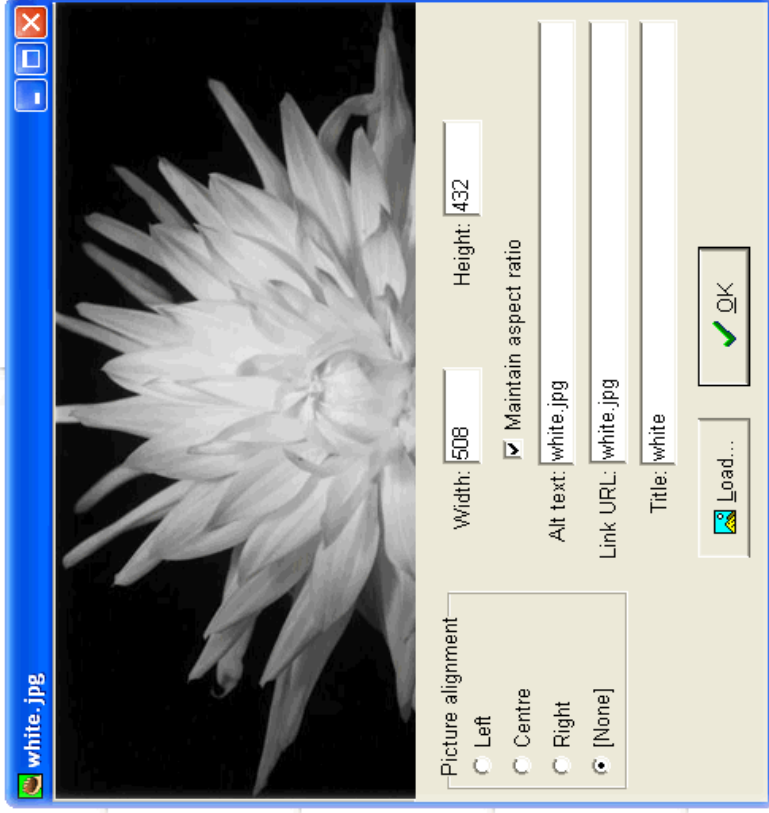


HP: 'Match activities'

JMatch enables you to match paired words, word to picture, 2 parts of a sentence, etc...

1. Paired words or 2 parts of a sentence: First give it a name, e.g. 'Les contraires'. In the left column add ex. 'beau' and in the right column 'laid'. Use the 'tap' button on the keyboard to go to the next box. To add more than 5 pairs, simply click on the **upward** pointing arrow on the left-hand side of the screen.
2. When you have entered all the details you wanted, save your project. Click **File > Save >** (type a file name into the save box, e.g. **MAcontraires**) **> Save**.
3. To view your work, go to File > Create web page > You will have 3 choices:
 - a. Standard format: drop down menu, choose the correct answer
 - b. Drag and Drop: drag the words next to the correct answer
 - c. Flashcards
4. You will always be asked to save the file before you can view it on your browser, to make sure you do not save a file over another one, I use:
 - a. Standard format: MAcontraires**S**
 - b. Drag and Drop: MAcontraires**DD**
 - c. Flashcards: MAcontraires**FL**
5. Here again, you can change the font, colour, add a timer... Click on the 'configuration button' to edit your file.
6. You will be able to edit the whole activity if needs be.





To match a word / sentence to a picture:

1. First give it a name, e.g. 'Les couleurs.
2. Before you save it, create a folder called MAcouleurs. It will be much easy to upload onto moodle and easier to edit if needs be.
3. Save your Hot Potato activity in the new folder you have just created e.g. MAcouleurs (same name as the folder, easy to find!)
4. Before you can start this type of activity, you need to save all the pictures you will use in the activity in the folder you have just created. You must upload all these pictures onto moodle, so it will be easier to just upload the whole folder at once when we are ready to add it to moodle. We can just drag the folder into moodle.
5. In the left column add ex. 'blanc' and in the right column, click on 'Insert a picture from a file' (icon on the tool bar).
6. Depending on the size of the pictures you have in your folder you might have to resize them: e.g. 120-120
7. When you click on ok, you will not see the picture but only the link.
8. Use the 'tap' button on the keyboard to go to the next box. To add more than 5 pairs, simply click on the **upward** pointing arrow on the left-hand side of the window.
7. When you have entered all the details you wanted, save your project. Click **File > Save >** (type a file name into the save box, e.g. **MAcouleurspic**) > **Save**.
8. To view your work, go to File > Create web page > You will have 3 choices:
 - a. Standard format: drop down menu, choose the correct answer, **WILL NOT WORK IN THIS CASE**
 - b. Drag and Drop: drag the words next to the correct answer
 - c. Flashcards
9. You will always be asked to save the file before you can view it on your browser, to make sure you do not save a file over another one, I use:
 - a. Standard format: **will NOT work in this case**.
 - b. Drag and Drop: MAcouleurspic**DD**
 - c. Flashcards: MAcouleurspic**FL**
10. **Save everything in the same folder.**
